

Scheduled bulky waste collection



Broken household goods

- Furniture – e.g. tables, chairs, beds, and rugs.
- White goods – e.g. a broken washing machine or dishwasher.
- Iron and metal – e.g. large pots, barbecues, and bicycles.

Plastics and large cardboard items



- Large plastic items that do not fit in the regular plastic bin – e.g. plastic containers and buckets.
- PVC products – e.g. inflatable pools and air mattress.
- Large cardboard items – e.g. storage boxes and large cardboard boxes.

Hazardous waste



- Painting – e.g. buckets with remains from painting, varnish, and glue.
- Large batteries and light sources – e.g. fluorescent tubes, power tool batteries, and car batteries.

How to do it

- Sort small items in a clear sack. Bundle up large cardboard items.
- Mark bikes, pushchairs, and prams with “Storskrald” (bulky waste in Danish). Paint must be placed in a clear bag.
- Place your bulky waste neatly.
